Offer from Estonia to host the WCCC 2025 in Tallinn

Being a small country Estonia is surprisingly big in chess. Not so much in problem chess, but the potential is there if we nurture it. WCCC would be perfect for sowing seeds in fertile ground. We have never befor hosted a Problem Chess Conference but larger chess tournaments are recurring.

Good weather in October is a gamble, but the Old Town Tallinn is worthwhile visiting at any time of the year, the number of tourists attest to this. Tallinn is one of the smallest capital cities, and the international Lennart Meri Tallinn Airport (TLL) is nearby. A taxi would take you to the hotel in just 10 minutes.





Our proposal as period is 5-12 July 2025 and as host the city of Alba Iulia, an historical place for our country, where it is the largest fortress in Romania.

Alba Iulia is an important chess center, hosting form 2016 till now the International Chess Tournament of Romania and from 2022 the final of the circuit Grand Prix Romania.

FIDE World Cup in Composing and other FIDE supported projects

Dear delegates, honorary members, and other active promoters of chess composition,

As you know, since 2018 the yearly WFCC budget donated by FIDE has been 3000€ (after dropping from 10000€ down, and then from 5000€ down).

In the period 2019-23, FIDE allocated yearly budget of 10000€ for the FIDE World Cup in Composing: 4000€ to the 8 winners, 4000€ to the 8 judges, 1000€ to the director and 1000€ for other expenses (cups, medals, certificates, etc). The FIDE initial decision was that the World Cup budget should be the only support to WFCC, but luckily the WFCC yearly budget of 3000€ remained.

The FIDE World Cup was personally initiated and organized by Andrey Selivanov and his team, while WFCC was approving it. The sanctions on Russia prevented smooth organization in 2023, and in 2024 we were left without the WC organizing team.

The FIDE Executive Officer Victor Bologan kindly offered WFCC not to lose this part of FIDE support in 2024, but to reallocate the same 10000€ to the three new FIDE supported projects: the FIDE Youth Solving Events (4000€), FIDE Album (3000€), and a booklet celebrating FIDE Centenary (3000€).

The booklet with 101 endgames from the period 1924-2024, selected and commented by Gady Costeff, is currently in the process of preparations by the publisher Peter Gvozdják.

The FIDE Album Committee will suggest where to allocate the relevant part of the FIDE support, and that will surely help us in regular work.

Preparations for the 1st FIDE & WFCC World Solving Championships for Cadets and Juniors have been going on intensively, as you might have seen in the WFCC social media or on the FIDE website:

All promotional activities for the FIDE solving events have been based on volunteering; including a series of free online solving lessons, organized by young Anirudh Daga and me (317 participants registered by now). Two more sessions remained, and it's still possible to <u>register here</u>.

The FIDE supported budget for the inaugural events in Brazil (4th November) and Italy (21st November) is allocated for the costs of the competitions, including expenses of selector, director and helpers among WFCC members.

In the recent talk, Mr. Bologan announced FIDE will be willing to keep supporting FIDE special projects in chess composition with the same amount of 10000€ in 2025. He expressed satisfaction with development of the FIDE solving events, and his wish to include solving in other FIDE events and among other age categories. At the same time, he pointed that it is on WFCC to decide what projects will be offered in the frames of the same 10000€ budget.

Many composers would like to see the tradition of the World Cup going on. In the new circumstances we should decide about possible changes in its format, budget and organizing team.

While considering the questions below, do have in mind the concrete jobs to be done and your own possible contribution to them:

- 1. Do we need the FIDE World Cup in the same format and with the same budget as before?
- 2. Having in mind lack of volunteers (directors and judges), would it be better to have WC:
- a) every second year?
- b) yearly, but covering half of the genres (4) each year?
- c) yearly, covering 6 genres, but changing the types of genres in the last four sections?

(For instance, one year with #2, #3, S#2-3, h#2-3, helpselfmates, and proof-games, and next year: #n, endgames, S#n, h#n, other fairies and classic retro)

- 3. What part of the FIDE yearly support should be spent on the World Cup and on what expenses that money should be distributed?
- 4. Would you be ready to personally support your proposal by taking over the roles of World Cup Director (selecting judges, communicating with them, creating final awards)? Or in some other way?
- 5. Could you suggest somebody else willing to take the role of WC Director?

Send your comments and suggestions during the next week or so. The bids for WCCC & ECSC 2025 (deadline 5th October), as well as your suggestions for the FIDE supported projects, will be on the table for voting during an online Meeting, around 25th October.

Dear all.

Three weeks ago I asked for your opinions about the future of the FIDE World Cup in Composing and other FIDE supported projects. Yesterday, I accepted the last portion of comments, coming from 12 (out of 43) delegates and 10 other prominent composers and organizers. Many thanks to all of you who have contributed, and especially to those who offered their personal services to support their proposals!

All contributors have agreed their replies may be presented to the others. So, **you will find each reply in the attached document**, in the order of appearance. I hope it will be interesting for you, the same as it was for me, to get to know the wide diversity of wishes, suggestions and opinions in our small community.

At the end of this note you will find the list of suggested questions for voting on 25th October. Feel free to suggest any changes, but not later than on 20th October!

As a summary of different opinions, you may see here an **approximate distribution of concrete preferences by the contributors**:

Replies, in the order of appearance:

Marco Guida:

- 1. Current format is like "yet another Tourney", with a single judge for each Section. It has the status of World Cup essentially under "marketing / branding" perspective. I feel that it should be maintained (it has its momentum already as a tourney) but ideally it should be changed as judging is concerned to guarantee a quality, fair and independent judging process. Ideally 3 judges, but I feel that asking 3 people not to participate might be a big obstacle to find each time high quality judges... To be practical, ultimately, let us stay with the current format! Finding 1 judge to assess a limited number of problems should not be too difficult.
- 2. My preference among your proposed alternatives go to having all sections, once every 2 years. Doing it every 2 years will allow more time for organisation, most notably for judging (last time Selivanov asked me to judge #2, but I had to refuse since all should be done in less than 1 month in a period of the year when I had already planned 2 weeks of holidays with my family).
- 3. Budget: I feel it should only cover money prizes for each Section winner (possibly the only thing that would still make the competition different from most of the Tourneys) and medals for the top-3 in each Section. Probably 5.000. € would be enough.
- 4. As my personal contribution to future FIDE World Cup, I am open to act as a judge (in #2), if the Director would feel that I am ok for the task. I am less keen to act as Director: too much of administrative / editorial work ... I have been Director in one of the past FIDE Album and I feel that FIDE World Cup will be much more demanding over a much shorter period of time. I am not saying "Never", but it will depend very much on "when".

- P.S. Yesterday I had a quick chat on the topic of FIDE World Cup with Mario PARRINELLO. He believes that offering some money to Judges & Director will also be helpful to secure quality judges, as a compensation for not being allowed to participate themselves.

I also believe that if FIDE WC will be held every 2 years it would make sense. Over 2 years you will have 20.000 from FIDE, of which 50% will finance one FIDE WC and 50% will remain available to finance other projects.

I would be reluctant to offer money to judges in case of yearly frequency, since I believe that other projects aiming to secure a future to chess composition (composing and solving) need and deserve some funding ...

Vlaicu Crisan:

Please find below the answers provided by the active Romanian chess composers present at WCCC:

- 1. Three of us say "No", the fourth says "Yes".
- 2. Option c) seems attractive for three of us.
- 3. No answer.
- 4-5. Two of us: no answer, the other two: "I would prefer not to".

Now, let me elaborate a little bit these answers.

Ovidiu thinks - and I agree with him - FIDE World Cup could be sponsored by other multinational societies, not necessary only from FIDE. Expecting a success ratio of 2%, one must make 100 inquiries to get 2 positive answers. Ovidiu is the only one who thinks the current format should be preserved and the budget increased. He thinks that young composers will be attracted to chess

composition only when they will see this activity has a future and they can win some money. Please keep in mind that Ovidiu is the only one who is training kids to play chess.

Paul and **Eric** won't cry too much if the sections #2, #3, s#2-3 and h#2-3 would be completely removed.

For the role of World Cup Director I think it should be someone who knows both English and Russian languages, which automatically disqualifies us.

Please keep in mind three of us have / had editing experience: Paul - Quartz, Eric - Mat Plus, I - Problem Paradise.

We all know how difficult is to find judges and to be held responsible when these judges fail to accomplish their promise to deliver timely an award.

Therefore I think this responsibility should be somehow passed to the WFCC delegates themselves. Each delegate should nominate one judge and only one section. The World Cup Director should only choose among the nominated countries, making sure no country appears more than once in the final list.

Another concern is the communication with the composers. I would prefer all this process to be automated - not only for the FIDE World Cup, but for all WFCC official competitions including YCCC: it should be not the director's responsibility to enter manually the position / solution from a hand made drawing or a screenshot! As an editor I regularly have this kind of experience with many other composers. That's why I would recommend using an online platform such as MatPlus.net for submitting the originals for the FIDE World Cup.

Last, but not least, I have some concerns. Due to economic sanctions imposed to Russia, it might be difficult to make money transfers. Some composers (and judges) complained in the past they didn't receive the money when Andrey Selivanov acted as FIDE World Cup Director. In case the director will be from an European country respecting the sanctions, then the same issue might happen with the money transfers to Russian winners / judges. Eric thinks this issue can be neglected, considering FIDE has bank accounts everywhere in the world, but I think this is not applicable for WFCC as well. Vlaicu

Michal Dragoun:

I am sending my negativistic notes concerning the World Cup in composing. Please note that all are purely my personal opinions and that meanings of the Czech delegate, who is representative of Czech problemist association, can be completely different.

- 1. Do we need the FIDE World Cup in the same format and with the same budget as before? No. (My feeling based on lists of participants is that it did not acquire some wider popularity in former "western Europe" and thus it is not something comparable e.g. to WCCT. In my opinion there is no need for World Cup at all.)
- 2. Having in mind lack of volunteers (directors and judges), would it be better to have WC:
- a) every second year?
- b) yearly, but covering half of the genres (4) each year?
- c) yearly, covering 6 genres, but changing the types of genres in the last four sections? (For instance, one year with #2, #3, S#2-3, h#2-3, helpselfmates, and proof-games, and next year: #n, endgames, S#n, h#n, other fairies and classic retro)

From these three I consider the possibility 2a as the best one, as some amount of work is needed every time and thus e.g. 2×2b is more work than 1×2a.

Nothing. I would allocate some part of the support to the organization and prizes in tourneys for beginning composers - I think it is already so, although probably from different source. (Off topic concerning the payments for the World Cup judges – e.g. judges of FIDE Album or WCCI have much more work and they receive no reward, but of course, I don't know, if some reward for them is realistic in the relation to the FIDE, as FA and WCCI have longer periods.)

Mario Parrinello:

I have in general positive feelings for this competition and generally speaking for any tournament that promotes our art.

In more detail, I was not able to answer all your questions but I'm convinced that this competition should be mantained and that it should include all sections without splitting them.

In regard whether it would be organized every year rather than every second year I have more doubts and concerns since it is strictly linked to one of the most challenging organitazional problems, namely lack of volunteers.

I suggest to allocate a prize money (say 200 euros or so, this is just indicative) also for all judges and directors; that would perhaps convince some people to willingly face the judging/directoring duty instead to take part in the competion as composer. By the way, I would be willing to act as judge, even without prize money, but my job prevents me to accept the duty, at least at the moment. Mario

Valery Kopyl:

Ukraine is of the opinion that the FIDE World Cup should be held in the former format: in 8 sections annually, with a total budget of 10000€. The only point that could be adjusted would be to award money prizes to composers in the top three positions (instead of the sole winner) in each section. Moreover, we believe that the WFCC leadership is to blame for the failure to conduct the traditional World Cup in 2024. The World Cup is chess composers' third most important tournament, after WCCT and WCCI. FIDE provided funds precisely for the World Cup as a FIDE-supported project. Therefore, it is certainly inadmissible to reallocate FIDE's target funding to other WFCC competitions. Attracting funds from sponsors for holding WCCT, WCCI, solvers' world and European championships would be the right approach.

Ukrainian composers are ready to act as judges in any World Cup sections in 2025. We are also ready to nominate a candidate for the position of World Cup 2025 Director.

Ukraine is of the opinion that no separate WFCC Committee or Commission is required for organizing and holding the FIDE World Cup, since the entire organization of the tournament can be implemented by the Director appointed by WFCC leadership.

We also believe that after February 24, 2022 (the day when the russian federation began its invasion of Ukraine to seize territories and exterminate Ukrainians), no representative of russia should be a member of any WFCC Committee.

Moreover, we would like to draw your attention once again to the unacceptably long pause between the end of WCCT-11 and the start of WCCT-12. The WCCT-12 Director must be selected/appointed as soon as possible; then the Director will select the judges, hold a voting on the proposed themes and provide for the start of WCCT-12 not later than March 1, 2025.

WFCC: Proposal for the suspension of the delegate for Russia

Dear delegates and honorary members

Those among us who attended the final meeting of the delegates at the WCCC in Jurmala had to listen to an appalling statement by the Russian delegate which trivialized the barbarian actions committed by the Russian forces in Ukraine. I am one of the senior delegates of the WFCC (and formerly PCCC), but this statement was by far the worst moment that I have experienced in all this time.

Over the years, there have always been differences of opinion among the delegates. But even if the discussions were heated at times, we have managed to maintain a minimum of respect and decency. After all, we are all concerned with the welfare of chess composition.

Not this time, though!

I can understand that we were all shocked to the point that nobody was able to find an appropriate response to this statement during the meeting in Jurmala. But I would consider it an unforgivable mistake if we were to simply continue with our agenda as if this statement had never been made. Such an approach would have to be understood as our silent agreement, an impression which we must avoid.

In all our meetings held since Russia started the war in Ukraine, the WFCC delegates had to deal with a proposal by Ukraine to expel Russia and Belarus from our Federation. I have always opined against these

proposals, assuming that most Russian problemists, with their international connections, have a different, more informed view of the world than the majorities of Russians who apparently still support their dictator.

After the mentioned statement, however, I would consider it a disaster to have this particular Russian delegate at our physical or virtual conference tables again. Having seen how many of us left the conference room in protest during his statement, I assume that I am not alone with my opinion.

I hereby ask the Presidium to take appropriate action now: suspend Russia from their participation in the meetings of WFCC delegates and in WFCC committees until they replace their delegate with a person with minimal human traits such as respect, and regard for human life. If Russia should fail to do so, proceed with the expulsion of Russia at our Ordinary Meeting at next year's WCCC according to Annex II of our Statutes; I sincerely hope that this last measure won't be necessary.

Georgy Evseev, Jurmala WCCC 02.08.2024:

"Frankly speaking, last year in Batumi I expected that someone, at least any person, would come to me and will ask what Russia thinks about the situation, why is it happening, are there any opinions, reasons or something like this. No one. No one has done it. So I think our proposal (to host WCCC 2025) is made in a good sense and is based on WFCC Statutes. We have Article 2 which requires for dissemination of chess composition, not for building the barriers, preventing interaction and making the opponents. So. as far as I see, your opinions are based on your media information and are very limited.

The fact is that there was quite a lot of fake information from Ukraine which very much increases and oversizes the real problems in Ukraine. In Ukraine, the shops are working, the resorts are working, the cities look normal, not like in Iraq, not like in Syria, they look quite normal. The most fighting has taken place on the line of conflict currently. So there are many videos from Ukrainian people from different cities which look quite normal.

So, really, there is no threat for local people in Ukraine who are not on the line of fight. Ukraine, at the same time, attacks Russian-boundary cities and villages, and very much attacks on civilian infrastructure near the line of conflict. I don't want to talk about it in detail, but anyway, this is what I wanted to say. There is a good possibility for the people to see it with their own eyes. This year I visited Italy and Germany without any problems. I went one side through Baku and backwards through Istanbul. I would say that Italian people, which I've seen there, were generally very positive. They don't have this kind of presumption against Russia or something like this. So, I understand this position of the delegates, but I think that it is very much biased and I would ask you to think it over again."

The statement of the Presidium on the matter:

After having analysed the facts and ideas presented in the letter received on 16 October 2024 from Mr. Thomas Maeder, delegate of Switzerland at WFCC, we, the Presidium of WFCC, are making the following statement:

On 2 August 2024, at the final meeting of WFCC Congress in Jurmala, Mr. Georgy Evseev, in his capacity as Russia's delegate at WFCC, had to sustain his country's offer for organizing the WFCC Congress in 2025. In his speech held by zoom, Mr. Evseev used some political arguments (in the line of his country's position), which determined several delegates to leave the hall, in protest. In his letter, Mr. Maeder is accusing Mr Evseev, for having "trivialized the barbarian actions committed by the Russian forces in Ukraine" and is asking us "to suspend Russia from their participation in the meetings of WFCC delegates and in WFCC committees until they replace their delegate with a person with minimal human traits such as respect, and regard for human life".

We have taken note of these above and we consider that the emotional approaches, which are leading to political attitudes (implicit or expressed explicitly), are undesirable in our Federation. At the same time, our attributions as Presidium are functioning only in the context of chapter 9.3 of the Statutes, so any harsher measures taken can be regarded as an abuse of power.

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1.We recommend to Mr. Evseev to reconsider his attitude shown at the last WFCC Congress and to put it into accord with his quality of WFCC Honorary Member.

2.We ask the WCCT Committee to schedule an online internal meeting, led by one of its members, preferably Mr. Harry Fougiaxis, Honorary President of WFCC. This meeting has to discuss the compatibility of Mr. Evseev with the position of spokesman of WCCT Committee, keeping in regard that he is representing (with political positions assumed) a country suspended from WCCT, all on the background of an obvious inactivity of this Committee. The Presidium will not interfere, neither in the debate nor in the decision, because WFCC Committees are independent in the matter of electing their spokesmen.

3.We shall put on the agenda of the WFCC online meeting on 25th October 2024 the proposals made by Mr. Maeder.

Our hope is that rationality will remain the ruler of our chess field and reciprocal tolerance will be the permanent line of conduct, reasons for which we invite all the members to do their best in order to preserve WFCC's image and their own prestige.
