

# 26<sup>th</sup> Sabra Composing Turney – 65<sup>th</sup> WCCC, Batumi 2023


An orthodox H#2 was required with the following theme:

A black line-piece moves along the line on B1, making a critical move, and another black piece moves onto that line on B2, making an interference (on the critical square) of the piece moving on B1. The mate is given on a square found on the blocked line (as in the example on the left) or on a line unguarded by the interference on B2 (as in the example on the right).




A total of 60 problems took part in the competition – I received them anonymously from the tourney director, Paz Einat. Anticipation search was done on all problems that were prize candidates.
