



Solution: 1.Bb2! [2. d4+ cxd3 e.p. 3.c4#]

1...Ra3 2. Qg7 **A** [3.Sg4# **B**]

2...Sd plays 3.S(x)f7# **D**

2...Sdxe4 **a** 3.Qc7# **C**

2...Rxc3 3.Bxc3#

1...Bf2 2.Qc7 **C** [3.Sf7# **D**]

2...Sf plays 3.S(x)g4# **B**

2...Sfxe4 **b** 3.Qg7# **A**

- Pins / self-pins
- Black corrections
- Banny theme
- Pseudo Lender --> Combination of Pseudo Salazar and Pseudo Le grand for second and third moves
- 1.A? (2.B#) 1...a/b 2.C#/D#
- 1.C! (2.D#) 1...c/d 2.A#/B#
- Homogeneous defences. The first black move gives up control of the black knight. The second is a self-pin which allows the mat Banny
- The moves Qc7 and Qg7 appear as 1st moves in tries, second moves and mat in the solution (Urania theme)

Perhaps, the FIRST Pseudo-Lender Combination in 3# !!!



But 1. ... Rxa4! **a**

Try: 1.Re7? **C** ad lib 2.Rxf5# **D**

But 1. ... Rf8! **b**

Solution: 1.Rh5! [2.Rh1 ad lib 3.Re1#]

1...Rxa4 **a** 2.Rxf5+ **D** exf5 3.Re7# **C**

1...Rf8 **b** 2.Sxc4+ **B** dxc4 3.Rxc5# **A**

1...Rb6 2. Rxc5 **A** ad lib 3.Sxc4# **B**


- Hannelius theme between the tries 1.Rxc5? & 1.Re7? and the solution

- Interchange of white second and third moves for 1...Rf8 and 1...Rb6

- Active sacrifices



1...Bxf4 2.Qh4 [3.Sf6♯] Rd5 3.Sf6♯

1...Rxf4 2.Qh6 [3.Sf6♯] Rd5 3.Sf6♯

1...Rxg3 2.Sxg3+ Kxf4 3.Qh4♯

2...Kd5 3.Qxe5♯ changed

- Ampliative key
- Four defenses on the same case to which respond to four different second moves of the White Queen (duel case / piece)

Problems showing a case / piece duel with ampliative key are rare.



1.Bxf5? **A** [2.Sxf7+ Sxf7 3.Sg6♠]

1...Sxf8 **a** 2.exd5 **B** [3.Re4♠] Bxd5 3.Rxd5♠

1...Rxd6 2.Sec6+!! Bxc6 3.Bxd6♠

2...Rxc6 3.Rxd5♠

but 1...dxe4! give the case f5

1.exd5? **B** [2.Sxf7+ Sxf7 3.Sg6♠]

1...Sxf8 **a** 2.Bxf5 **A** [3.Re4♠] Bxd5 3.Rxd5♠

but 1...f4! unblock the case f5

1.Bxd5? **C** [2.Sxf7+ Sxf7 3.Sg6♠]

1...Sxf8 **a** 2.exf5 **D** [3.Re4♠] Bxd5 3.Rxd5♠

but 1...Rxd6! white block on d5 and line opening e6-g6 (see 1.Bxf5?)

1.exf5! D [2.Sxf7+ Sxf7 3.Sg6♠]

1...Sxf8 **a** 2.Bxd5 **C** [3.Re4♠] Bxd5 3.Rxd5♠

1...fxe6 2.Bg7+ Sf6 3.Bxf6♠

- Reversal theme doubled, very rare only 2 other examples in 3# :



- In 2 #, the reversal theme requires the creation of a battery. The scheme, shown here, is only possible in 3 # or more.
- 4 white moves (Tries and Real Play) lead after defense 1 ... Sc8 to the same mate position, but 3 fail (false symmetry).

} focal theme

1.Bxc5? **B** [2.Sf1 [3.Sg3‡]]

- Quiet moves

- **Two White corrections 1.dxc5? → 1.dxe5? & 1.Bxc5? → Bxe5! very rare in 3#**

- 4 white moves (Tries and Real Play) lead after defense 1 ... Bxb5 to the same mate position, but 3 fail (false symmetry).

- **Theme Reversal (Salazar) doubled very rare**
