C09 – a very complicated idea. However, there are five variations 1... ♖h8, 1... ♖e8, 1... ♖a8, 1... ♖:g7 and 1... ♖c5+ with a large number of duals on the second, third and fourth moves.

C10 – anticipated by F.Davidenko, B.Milosevski-70JT, 2015, 3rd Prize, www.yacpdb/480058.

C13 – three variations met in miniature E.Markov “The Problemist”, 2001, www.yacpdb/70256. To implement the fourth variation, the author added 18 pieces. In this case, four white pieces ♖b3, ♖e4, ♗a1 and ♘d3 in the solution do not play.

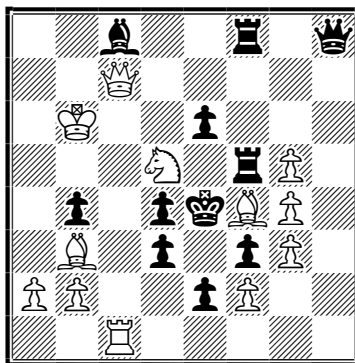
C18 – the first move takes away the free square from the black King. In both variations the repetition of the second and third moves.

C25 – zero-position with multiple permutations. The first two twins repeat five moves in a row.

C29 – cook in seven moves 1. ♗g4 ♗g5 2. ♗:g5 ♖f1 3. ♗f7+ ♖g6 4. ♖g5+ ♖f6 5. ♖f5+ ♖e6 6. ♖e5/ ♖h5+ ♖f6 7. ♖e6#.

C33 – both black Bishops in white squares.
