

1.Rc3! (Rc~?) d3 2.Bxd3 Sf3#

(1. *Rc~? tempo? 2.Ld3 2.Sf3#*) (1.*Bd3? tempo? 2.Rc3 Sf3#*)

1.Qd5! (Q~?) e5 2.Bxe5 Be3#


(1. *Q~? tempo? 2.Le5 2.Le3#*) (1.*Be5? tempo? 2.Qd5 Be3#*)

White tempo moves on self-blocking squares, with unpin of white mating pieces(Black corrections). An excellent achievement.

According to the author: “Tries with inversion of black moves (1.Bd3? & 1.Be5? –both Vladimirov effects) prevent White to make the necessary move.”


Unique presentation of thematic feature: White occupies the square which is needed for Black tempo move!

Probably the first H#2 showing four different Black tempo moves by four different units in two solutions - an incredible finding!

1.Sgf6 (Be2?) Qf2 2.Be2 Sxe3 #

(1.Be2? Qf2?? 2.Sgf6 Se3#)

1.Rf6 (Sc5?) Qc8 2.Sc5 Se7 #

(1.Sc5? Qc8?? 2.Rf6 Se7#)


Different black self-blocks on f6, creation of black half-pin by the Q, then interference on a black line allows the mate.

The tries with inversion of black moves fail because of the harmful effect of interfering with a Q-line (Vladimirov effects in helpmate genre).


