



A swastika (religious symbol) in the stylish pattern of king moves and a 4 fold complete cycle in the required theme. All are model mates too. White and black monopoly too

Theme: in one phase a mating move is a move of White piece on the same square on which in final position of another phase Black King stands.







Neat exchange of functions between bBe4 and bRf6. B1 opens the line for a white piece and also self blocks. The other black piece is captured either in W1 or W2 forming a 2x2 pair of solutions.



Critical moves on B1 (which optimally shows the required theme) with interference on the same square e3. Nice magnetic rook moves on B1 and dual avoidance at f5 on B2 adds to the beauty! Also a meredith with a mirrored black king

Theme: Avoidance of wrong move order In the initial position of an orthodox helpmate in two, the 1st and the 2nd Black's moves are legal in each solution. The wrong order of Black's moves (try) fails due to specific harmful effect which occurs in the 1st White's move. The 1st and the 2nd Black's moves must be played by different units in each solution.

In the diagrammed position, d4 square is controlled by two white pieces; but ultimately both of them leave and finally a black piece has to self block d4. This is a beautiful exemplification of Bukovina theme. There is also Zilahi and Rope theme in this pleasing economical construction with just 10 men on board

Theme: In an orthodox helpmate in two moves a black or white piece blocks a white line. In one phase the blocking piece comes out of the line and in the other phase it is removed from the line.
