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From the tourney Director Yuri Bazlov I have received 43 anonymous problems.

A level of problems was high, it gave undoubted pleasure at analysis of these compositions.

There were sent entries of different styles. I excluded only three works:

F25 – extra set (promoted) pieces;

F34 – strong anticipation


[yacpdb/468051](#). Such concept with analogous play in this cycle of White moves is already realized (without a dual in strong additional variation and without a promotion in key, as in F34). But substitution of one thematic piece turned out to be promising and allowed to get a best construction (see F34A at the end of the award) with five less pieces;

F43 – strong dual in a variation of solution: 1...b2 2.e8 \mathbb{W} (\mathbb{A})+ \mathbb{A} f7 3. \mathbb{W} a6+ \mathbb{W} :a6#.

Some compositions with interesting concepts would pretend on distinctions but realizations were unlucky. For example: rude flight-taking key for White King; absence of answers for checks in diagram position; unjustifiably repetitive finals in variations and etc.





Adabashev synthesis 2x2. In 1st and 2nd variations – reciprocal change of annihilations of Pawns “r” with line-opening for linear pieces. In 3rd and 4th variations – preparing for Black battery play on mating move.

Pity that short threat and Black dual on mating move somewhat spoil the impression of a rather good and interesting concept.

Adabashev synthesis. In 1st and 2nd variations – WCCT-7 theme combined with reciprocal change of 2nd and 3rd White move. In 3rd and 5th variations – an attraction of Black Queen. In 4th and 5th variations – WCCT-11 theme with creation of direct Black battery for a defense from a threat.

For more identical play, it begs to make a play with mating final 3... $\mathbb{Q}:f6\#$ in third pair of variations and to add 6th variation with attraction of Queen. Without it, the problem causes a feeling of disharmony.
